Guidelines for Completion of an Application for Certificate of Practice

Partnership



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When filing an Application for Certificate of Practice, include the following:

- 1. *Curriculum Vitae (page 1; item 4);
- 2. *Notification to Employer (page 1; item 5);
- 3. *Engineers Certificate of Authorization (page 1; item 8);
- *Business Registration (page 2; item 9);
- 5. Payment of Applicable Fees (refer to Payment of Fees form).

IMPORTANT

In order to offer or provide architectural services to the public in Ontario, as defined in the *Architects Act*, an individual or entity must be the holder of a Certificate of Practice. The provision of architectural services, prior to the issuance of a Licence and Certificate of Practice, may be prejudicial to the granting of a Licence and/or a Certificate of Practice.

Until an application for a Certificate of Practice is approved by the OAA, it is a contravention of the *Architects Act* to promote, offer, or provide architectural services in Ontario in the name of the new practice, and items such as letterhead, cheques, signs, etc., should not be ordered.

The use of the term Certificate of Practice in this document shall at all times refer to a Certificate of Practice issued by the OAA unless otherwise stated.



General

- Allow approximately four to six weeks of processing time from the date of receipt of the completed application and all required documentation. An incomplete application will be delayed as it may be returned for completion. NOTE: ENSURE YOU HAVE ANSWERED ALL QUESTIONS OR YOUR APPLICATION WILL BE DEEMED INCOMPLETE.
- 2. All sections of the application are to be completed. The terms "Not Applicable" and "N/A" may be used where sections do not apply.
- 3. All documentation submitted will be verified.
- 4. In order to satisfy the currency requirement outlined in Subsection 17(2) of the *Architects Act*, the OAA architect who is a principal of this practice and who is not currently a holder of a Certificate of Practice, must enclose an updated **curriculum vitae** with a chronological record of work experience covering at least the five years immediately preceding the date of this application.
- 5. **Notification to Employer Regulation 27 Subsection 34(b):** The OAA architect, who is a principal of this practice and is currently employed elsewhere must submit a copy of the notification provided to the employer (Notice) together with confirmation that the employer received the Notice. Confirmation can take the form of:
 - (a) an email to the employer attaching the notice,
 - (b) a copy of the Notice signed by the employer, or
 - (c) such further and other evidence as deemed acceptable by OAA staff.

The following is a sample of wording that may be used:

"This is to advise that it is my intention to offer and/or provide architectural services to the public and to apply to the Registrar of the Ontario Association of Architects for a Certificate of Practice.
I hereby further advise that such architectural services will not be performed during the hours I am employed by nor will I use any material, equipment, or facilities belonging to for this purpose.
I will advise my clients and other parties of my status as an employee and the attendant limitations on my services to ensure that my work will not conflict with my duties as an employee.
I will assume all professional liability for the architectural services I will provide as a holder of a Certificate of Practice and will indemnify and hold harmless from any claims arising from my practice."

The **Standards of Practice** are prescribed in Sections 47 and 49 of Ontario Regulation 27, as amended.

7. REAPPLICATION OR REINSTATEMENT REQUIREMENTS

- A former OAA architect who has voluntarily surrendered their Certificate of Practice may submit an application to reapply for a Certificate of Practice.
- ii. A former OAA architect whose Certificate of Practice was cancelled may make application to **reinstate** the Certificate of Practice.
- iii. Please note the applicant must:
 - a) provide evidence to the Registrar that the person who will personally supervise and direct the practice of architecture has, before the date of the application, completed a cycle of Continuing Education that meets the requirements of the Continuing Education program established under Section 54 of the Regulation.
 - b) file with the Registrar an Undertaking in which they affirm they have not engaged in the practice of architecture in the Province of Ontario from the date of surrendering or cancellation of their Certificate of



Practice, except as an employee of a holder of a Certificate of Practice or as an employee of an organization that did not offer architectural services to the public.

- 8. If this practice intends to provide **engineering services**, enclose a copy of the current Certificate of Authorization issued by the Association of Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO) under the *Professional Engineers Act* of Ontario.
- 9. The Business Names Act (BNA) applies to all types of business that operate under a name other than the owner's name. For further details, contact the Companies and Personal Property Security Branch at 416-314-8880 or check the website www.ontario.ca. If applicable, enclose a copy of the Business Registration from the Companies and Personal Property Branch, Ministry of Government Services.

If the business operating under a Certificate of Practice uses a business name other than that contained on the Certificate of Practice, the holder of the Certificate of Practice and all architects working under it must ensure compliance with the following:

- a) The Office of the Registrar of the OAA must be notified of all of the other names used; and
- b) The name of the holder of the Certificate of Practice must be included in all significant documents (e.g. contracts, invoices, letterhead, business cards, architectural drawings, etc.) so that the public can identify the official name of the entity with whom they are dealing.
- 10. **Mobility of Architectural Practices to Ontario (Reciprocal Applicants):** In order to hold a Certificate of Practice, an architect licensed in Ontario is subject to the requirements of the *Architects Act*, Regulation, and Bylaws, including those relating to professional liability insurance coverage.
- 11. All documents prepared by an Architect licensed in Ontario that govern a project's construction, alteration, or enlargement must be sealed with a seal issued to that member by the OAA. For more information regarding OAA professional seals, visit the OAA Website here.

Applying for a seal

- 1. An **applicant for a Certificate of Practice** may apply for a seal after their Certificate of Practice has been approved, or have a seal when making application for the Certificate of Practice.
- 2. For an **employee of a holder of a Certificate of Practice** to be eligible for a seal, the holder of the Certificate of Practice must provide confirmation in writing to the OAA indicating that the seal will be used only for projects under that holder.
- 3. For an **employee of other than a holder of a Certificate of Practice** (e.g. federal or provincial government, banks, etc.) to be eligible, the employer must provide confirmation in writing to the OAA indicating the seal will be used only for projects owned by the employer; the entity that owns the projects must be the one and the same that employs the licensee.

Once you have a seal

- 1. The employer must notify the Office of the Registrar at officeoftheregistrar@oaa.on.ca of any changes to the Certificate of Practice.
- 2. The employee must immediately notify the Office of the Registrar at officeoftheregistrar@oaa.on.ca of any changes to their employment status.

To obtain a **physical OAA Seal**, complete the <u>application form</u>. Please ensure you have read and understand the guidelines.

Once complete, submit your application to the Office of the Registrar at officeoftheregistrar@oaa.on.ca. To accompany the issuance of a physical or digital seal, the OAA will provide the applicant with high-resolution images of their seal to be used in conjunction with the chosen official type of seal.

OAA Seals must remain under the sole control of the licensee; they cannot be shared or delegated under any circumstances.

12. All applicants for a Certificate of Practice with an office in Ontario must also submit an Application for annual professional liability insurance coverage for the practice, unless the Certificate of Practice application represents a change in particulars of an existing holder of a Certificate of Practice with an office in Ontario. (Section 48, Regulation 27, as amended).

Please contact **Pro-Demnity Insurance Company** for the appropriate forms.

All applicants for a Certificate of Practice with an office outside of Ontario or whose primary function is not to engage in the practice of architecture and whose Certificate of Practice was issued under Subsections 14(2) or 15(a)(ii) or Sections 18 or 19 of the *Architects Act* must submit an application for Exemption from annual professional liability insurance coverage with Pro-Demnity Insurance Company.

Note: If a holder of Certificate of Practice located outside of Ontario:

- a) moves to Ontario; or
- b) decides to open an office in Ontario;

the holder's office in Ontario is required to be insured under Pro-Demnity Insurance Company and an Application for annual practice insurance must be submitted.

13. The **fees** for Certificate of Practice are set out on the Payment of Fees Form.



Completion of the Application

A. APPLICATION CATEGORIES

New Practice applies to an applicant who is not currently a holder of a Certificate of Practice, or who is currently a holder of a Certificate of Practice and this is a new and separate Certificate of Practice.

Change in Particulars of Existing Practice applies if the applicant is currently a holder of a Certificate of Practice and there is a change to the structure affecting the name of the Certificate of Practice.

If there are current projects for which architectural services are being provided by the existing practice, then:

- a) the Certificate of Practice for the existing practice must be maintained (refer to page 1; item 6) until completion of the architectural services; or
- b) these projects must be assigned to the holder of the new Certificate of Practice.

Note: Advise the OAA in writing whether a) or b) applies.

Personally Supervising and Directing: An architect in this practice must personally supervise and direct the practice of architecture on a **Full-Time basis**.

B. IDENTIFICATION

When choosing the name of the Certificate of Practice, refer to Appendix 2 of the Guidelines.

OTHER OFFICE

If it is the intention of the practice to have **more than one office** registered with the OAA (i.e. the principal and 'other office[s]'), **each** registered office must comply with the Standards of Practice (refer to page 1; item 6) and payment must be submitted for **each** 'other office' (refer to the Payment of Fees form).

C. PRACTICE HISTORY

Identify any Certificate of Practice not currently in good standing and provide the particulars.

D. PRACTICE STRUCTURE

In order for the Association to maintain a current Register of its architects and holders of Certificates of Practice, it is important to keep the practice structure correct and up to date. **Report all changes in writing to the Office of the Registrar.**

For ownership requirements, refer to Appendix 3 and Section 15 of the Architects Act.

The Partnership cannot be an LLP.

E. DECLARATION

It is the statutory responsibility of the OAA to ensure each principal of a Certificate of Practice has the requisite knowledge of Ontario laws before being granted a Certificate of Practice.

Applicants must have unrestricted access to the documents listed in Appendix 1. The OAA Official Documents are only available for downloading from the OAA Website.

Appendix 2 - Naming a Certificate of Practice

- 1) A Sole Proprietor may name their Practice:
 - a) A generic name;
 - b) A person's name as long as it is their name; or
 - c) A person's initials as long as it is their initials.
- A Partnership or Corporation may name a Practice and include the word "Architect," or any derivative thereof, if it is using:
 - a) A generic name;
 - b) An OAA member's name or former member's name if
 - i) they are part of the Practice; or
 - ii) have given authorization for their name to be used; or
 - c) An OAA member's initials or former member's initials if
 - i) they are part of the Practice; or
 - ii) have given authorization for their name to be used.
- 3) A Partnership or Corporation that does not use the word "Architect," or any derivative thereof in its name, may name the Practice:
 - a) A generic name;
 - b) A person's name, as long as
 - i) one name belongs to an OAA Member;
 - ii) they are part of the Practice; and
 - iii) have given authorization for their name to be used; or
 - c) A person's initials as long as:
 - i) an OAA member's initial or initials are included:
 - ii) the OAA member is part of the Practice; and
 - iii) has given authorization for their initial(s) to be used.
- 4) A Sole Proprietorship or Partnership or Corporation that is an existing architectural practice from another jurisdiction may use its existing name.
- 5) Style or Trade Names that are properly registered with the Province and the OAA may be used but only with the actual name of the Certificate of Practice—for example: Four Ontario Architects dba "pine trees".





Appendix 3 – Voting Interest and Financial Interest of Partnerships

In order for a Certificate of Practice application to be approved, the voting interest and value of all financial interest must meet two rules:

- 1. **51% of the voting interest** of the partnership applying for the Certificate of Practice must directly or indirectly be controlled and owned by:
 - a) OAA architects; or
 - b) OAA architects and Association of Professional Engineers of Ontario (PEO) engineers; or
 - c) PEO engineers.
- 2. **51% of the financial interest** of the partnership applying for the Certificate of Practice must directly or indirectly be held by:
 - a) OAA architects; or
 - b) OAA architects and PEO engineers; or
 - c) PEO engineers.

Ownership of Voting Shares - First Criteria

Voting interests are generally set out in the partnership agreement. The following examples illustrate the rules requiring voting interests. In essence, OAA architects and PEO engineers must own and control the majority of voting interest.


Example No. 1 – Acceptable

Holder of Certificate of Practice

51% of voting interest is owned by OAA architects/PEO engineers 49% of voing interest is owned by non-OAA architects/non-PEO engineers

This example is acceptable because 51% of the voting interest is owned by OAA architects and PEO engineers.

Example No. 2 - Acceptable





This example is acceptable because the OAA architects/PEO engineers owning the interest of Company A own the majority of voting interest of the Holding Company X that owns the majority of the interest of the holder of the Certificate of Practice.

Example No. 3 - Not Acceptable

Company A

49% of the voting shares are owned by OAA architects/PEO engineers. 51% of the voting shares are held by non-OAA architects/PEO engineers.

Holder of Certificate of Practice

Company A, Individual B, and Partnership C each have a 33 1/3 % interest in the partnership.

Partnership C

49% of the voting interest is owned by OAA architects/PEO engineers. 51% of the voting interest in the partnership is held by non-OAA architects/PEO engineers.

This example is not acceptable because two-thirds of the voting interest in the Holding Company (which owns all of the voting interest of the holder of the Certificate of Practice) is controlled by entities that are under the majority control of non-OAA architects and non-PEO engineers. Despite the fact that OAA architects and PEO engineers hold substantial minority voting rights in all of the entities, this structure does not pass the voting interest test.

Financial Interest - Second Criteria

Example No. 1 - Acceptable

Holder of Certificate of Practice


100% of voting interest is owned by OAA architects/PEO engineers and is valued at \$1000.

100% of non-voting interest is owned by non-OAA architects/non-PEO engineers and are valued at \$500.

This example is acceptable because the value of the voting interest is owned by OAA architects/PEO engineers is twice that of the shares owned by the non-OAA architects/non-PEO engineers.




Example No. 2 - Acceptable



This example is acceptable because the total value owned by architects/PEO engineers is more than 51% of the value.

- Company A, OAA architects/PEO engineers value total 60% of \$1000 = \$600.
- Partnership B, OAA architects/PEO engineers value total 49% of \$500 = \$245.
- Thus OAA architects/PEO engineers value is \$855 of \$1500 = 57%.

Example No. 3 - Not Acceptable



This example is not acceptable because the value of the non-voting interest, which are all held by non-OAA architects/PEO engineers, are worth more than the voting shares owned by the OAA architects/PEO engineers.
